PRESENT: Esther Terry, Joyce Long, Al Cooper, Steven Mullenix (by phone), Debbie Formyduval, Robin Irby, Thomas Vandiford, Eldora Tillery. David Woodson was absent.

CITIZEN COMMENT: None.

Chair Esther Terry called the meeting to order at 11:35 AM.

Joyce Long made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 10, 2019 meeting. The motion was seconded by Al Cooper and passed 4-0.

Steven Mullenix made a motion to accept the Directors Report as presented. The motion was seconded by Al Cooper and passed 4-0. (See attachment 1)

Steven Mullenix made a motion to make the formal Request for Replacement of the County Voting System to SBOE completing the requirements of SBOE numbered memo 2019-04. The motion was seconded by Joyce Long and passed 4-0. (See attachment 2)

Director Formyduval briefed the board on upcoming events including:

1. Approval of L & A Testing

A motion as made by Joyce Long to accept the results of L & A Testing for the 11/05/2019 Municipal Election and to make part of the record of the election. The motion was seconded by Al Cooper and passed 4-0.

2. Shared the Directors recommend hours of operation for the Warren County Board of Elections One Stop based on current legislation. Two plans were shared in addition to statistics about voter turnout from the 2016 Presidential Primary.

A motion was made by Joyce to adopt option 2 with two Saturdays for early voting. The first and last Saturday from 8:00 am until 3:00 pm. The motion as seconded by Al Cooper and passed 4-0. (See Attachment 3)

3. Shared prepared *Certificates of Election* for winners of the 11/05/2019 Municipal Election for signing by Chair Esther Terry with the understanding that the certificates are to be mailed by November 22, 2019 if no election protest are filed.

A motion was made by Steven Mullenix and seconded by Al Cooper regarding this action. The motion was passed 4-0.

- 4 Joyce Long made a motion to approve the notice of filing period for the March 3, 2020 Presidential Preference Primary. The motion was seconded by al Coper and passed 4-0.

Steven Mullenix made a motion to complete finalization of the contract for purchase of new voting systems and to forward the recommendation to the NCSBOE. The motion was seconded by Joyce Long and passed 4-0.

4. Shared conversations with Warren County Manager Vincent Jones regarding storage of the Voter Equipment and his recommendation to store at the old EMS site behind the Health Department. Director Formyduval shard that she had requested additional space at the BOE building. The board was in agreement that a letter should be drafted and forwarded to Chairman Davis requesting the space be allocated at the BOE site.
5. Planning for 2020 and the fact that ballots must be available by January 13, 2020 for mail absentee.
6. Training of Precinct Officials
7. Legal Notice Preparation
8. Precinct Accessibility Surveys and completion
9. NCOA Mailings in early January.
10. Voter Registration Drives and increased voter participation including a recent meeting attended by Deputy Director Irby with concerned citizens regarding registration drives at schools.
11. Security review by NC Nation Guard IT team at no cost to Warren County. Scheduled for week of 11/18/2019. Assessments have already been completed and submitted regarding servers and access to computers.
12. Deadline for Election Protest.

Esther Terry shared that Joyce Cooper had resigned from the Board and Al Cooper announced that his resignation would be forthcoming.

Being no further business before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 11:55 AM.

3. Placing the order for the voting equipment and forwarding documentation to the NCSBOE advising that all steps for purchase of new voting systems has been completed by Warren County.
4. Preparing materials for candidate filing (starting December 2, 2019).
5. Updating the election information table for voters.
6. Precinct setup for election day.
7. Complete sample audit of random precincts for 11/05/2019 election
8. Reconcile voter history and process registrations in que since close of books for election.
9. Complete and forward legal notice for 3/3/2020 election and forward to paper for proofing process.
10. Package and prepare rental laptops for pickup (EVID)
11. Return borrowed voting booths to Vance County Board of Elections.
12. Update website with legals, agendas and minutes
13. Provide abstract to municipalities and file copy with Clerk of Court.
14. Staff meets with local citizen group regarding voter outreach and education at schools.
15. Begin printing of materials for 2020 including provisional poll books
16. Poll workers have been contacted and our database is almost complete for the Presidential Primary.

Buffer zones as designated by G.S. 163-166.4(a), county board of elections, shall, where practical, set the limit at 50 feet from the door of entrance to the voting place, measured when that door is closed, but in no event shall it set the limit at more than 50 feet or at least 25 feet.

Voters will be asked to present acceptable photo identification when presenting to vote in person at the polls, with exceptions for voters who are unable to obtain acceptable photo identification, have a religious objection to being photographed, or are victims of a natural disaster. The acceptable forms of photo identification are a NC Driver's License or DMV-issued Identification Card (expired up to four years), US Passport or Passport Card (unexpired), Military ID Card or Veterans Affairs ID Card (unexpired, if there is an expiration date), and certain Tribal Enrollment Cards. VOTERS WHO ARE UNABLE TO OBTAIN ONE OF THESE FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION MAY STILL VOTE IF THEIR INABILITY IS DUE TO A REASONABLE IMPEDIMENT such as a lost or stolen ID, lack of transportation,

illness or disability, a lack of proper documents, work schedule, and others. These voters may vote a provisional ballot after completing a Reasonable Impediment Declaration and providing an alternate form of identification or the last four digits of their social security number and their date of birth. Acceptable alternate forms of identification for voters who complete a Reasonable Impediment Declaration include their voter registration card or a current utility bill, paycheck, government check, bank statement, or other government document bearing the voter's name and current address. Alternative voting options are available for voters who do not present acceptable photo identification for a reason other than a reasonable impediment to obtaining one. Voters who use curbside voting may also present one of the alternative forms of identification described above. Free Identification Cards for registered voters are available from the NC DMV or at the Board of Elections. For assistance with obtaining acceptable photo identification for voting or for more information on exceptions and alternative voting options, contact the NC State Board of Elections or visit www.VoterID.nc.gov. There you will find a complete list of acceptable photo ID's.

Polls will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. on Election Day. Canvass will be held in the **Warren County** Board of Elections office on **Tuesday, March 13, 2020 at 11:00 AM**.

Absentee ballots are allowed. Requests for an absentee ballot must be made on a State Board of Elections Absentee Request Form, available at the County Board of Elections office and at all

one-stop early voting sites, and received in the **Warren County** Board of Elections office or any one-stop early voting site by 5:00 p.m. on **February 25, 2020**. Completed absentee ballots must be returned to the **Warren County** Board of Elections by 5:00 p.m. on **Tuesday, March 3, 2020**.

All residents of **Warren County** who are registered to vote with the **Warren County** Board of Elections may vote in this election. **Voters who are previously registered need not re-register for this election. THOSE VOTERS WHO ARE REGISTERED UNAFFILIATED MAY VOTE IN THE PRIMARY ELECTION.** Unaffiliated voters will be given a choice of ballot at the polling places. Those residents of **Warren County** who are not registered to vote must register on or before **Friday, February 12, 2020** in order to be eligible to vote on Election Day. Those voters who are not registered by **Friday, February 12, 2020** may register and vote during one stop early voting only, and will be required to provide documentation of their identity and residence. Voters who wish to change their party affiliation or who have changed their name or address must notify the Board of Elections in writing by **February 12, 2020**. Voters who fail to notify the Board of Elections of a change to their name or address must update their information when presenting to vote, and may be required to vote a provisional ballot.

Voters who require assistance with casting their ballot are entitled to assistance by an appropriate person of their choice or an election official. Registration facilities and polling places are accessible to the elderly and handicapped. Curbside voting is available for voters who are not physically able to enter the polling place.

This is an official notice of an election to be conducted in **WARREN** County on **03/03/2020**. This notice contains a list of all of the ballot measures and federal, State, and local offices this county expects, as of this date, to be on the ballot on the date of the election. (See Attachment)

An Election Notice will be prepared not later than 100 days before a regularly scheduled election that permits absentee voting, and as soon as practicable in the case of an election or vacancy election not regularly scheduled. For a second primary, an Election Notice will be prepared, no later than the day following the date the appropriate board of elections orders that a second primary be held.

As soon as ballot styles are printed, this county board of elections will update this notice with the certified candidates for each office and ballot measures and referenda questions that will be on the ballot. For General Elections during even-numbered years, ballots will be printed **60 days** prior to the election. For statewide primaries and other elections (except municipal elections), ballots will be printed **50 days** prior to the election. Municipal ballots are available **30 days** prior to Election Day. **You must request an updated Election Notice.**

Transmitting a Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot:

This notice may be used in conjunction with the federal write-in absentee ballot (FWAB). Covered military & overseas voters seeking to vote by absentee ballot may use the FWAB to register to vote, request an absentee ballot, and vote an official military-overseas ballot. When using the FWAB to register to vote, and/or request an absentee ballot, please transmit your signed and completed FWAB no later than **5:00 p.m. on the day before Election Day**. If submitted later than this day and time, your absentee ballot will not be counted. Federal write-in absentee ballots are available at www.NCSBE.gov. You may also request a regular absentee ballot by using the federal postcard application (FPCA), available at www.FVAP.gov. A regular ballot can be mailed, faxed or emailed to you. You may return the FWAB or a regular absentee ballot by mail, secure fax (1-919-715-0351) or email (absentee@ncsbe.gov).

Marking a Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot:

When marking a FWAB, for each office for which you wish to vote, write in either a candidate's name or political party designation. For ballot measures or referenda, write either "YES" (you are *for* the ballot measure or referendum) or "NO" (you are *against* the ballot measure or referendum). In a primary, if you are registered as Democrat, Republican or Libertarian, for partisan contests, you may only vote for the candidates of the party for which you are affiliated. You are also eligible to vote for non-partisan contests. If you are registered as unaffiliated ("independent"), in a primary, you may choose to vote for the partisan contests of one of the parties or you may choose to vote for non-partisan contests only. Please contact your local board of elections to confirm your party affiliation or voter registration status.
