

MINUTES FROM THE MONTHLY MEETING HELD BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE COUNTY OF WARREN IN THE WARREN COUNTY ARMORY CIVIC CENTER MEETING ROOM, ON MONDAY, JULY 6, 2020 AT 6:00 PM.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Tare Davis. Other Commissioners present: Bertadean Baker, Victor Hunt, Jennifer Pierce and Walter Powell. Others in attendance: County Manager Vincent Jones and County Attorney Hassan Kingsberry.

Chairman Davis conducted prayer and pledge to the US flag.

On motion of Commissioner Hunt, which was seconded by Commissioner Baker and duly carried by unanimous vote, July 6, 2020 Suggested Agenda was adopted.

CITIZENS COMMENTS were as follows:

Ron Skow, citizen – apologized for stating the board did not hold a public hearing before adopting FY 2021 budget. He acknowledged that public hearing was June 1st.

JereAnn King-Johnson (written statement read by Clerk to the Board): “Good Evening Warren County Commissioners, County Manager, Attorney, Clerk, and Citizens of Warren County:

On this Monday following the 4th of July weekend, there is a lot on which to reflect regarding “freedom, liberty, and justice, especially for all.” America’s history is not a straight-ahead chronicle of Manifested Destiny and white supremacy. American’s story begins with the stain of the desecration of people native to these lands and wars fought to expand territories, control labor, and exploit natural resources, all for the benefit of a few. That is a simple statement that does not account for the history’s complexity and accretion of injustices, malice, and myths designed to maintain cultural divisions.

Now that the Confederate soldier’s statue is no longer on Warrenton’s Courthouse Square, the hard work begins. There is a lot of history enshrined in that statue, both myth, and reality. Most of the confederate monuments erected on public grounds in the late 19th Century and early 20th Century happened long after the Civil War and during periods of racial tension. Seen as symbols of white supremacy by whites and blacks, the monuments underscored Jim Crow laws and disenfranchisement of African Americans from voting and civil rights.

Understanding our history is critical to how we move forward in our community with humanity.

What can we say about our community’s racial injustices?

How do future generations understand the underlying meanings of the confederate monuments?

Why is truth-telling essential to freedom?

Here’s what I recommend:

- A plaque is placed at the site of the confederate monument, that tells a broader narrative than as a memorial to dead soldiers of the “Lost Cause.”
- That curricula created for Warren County schools are differentiated across grade levels to include African Americans’ struggles for freedom, full citizenship, and justice in the face of white terror and white supremacy.
- And lastly, public and community leaders encourage and support organized dialogues on race and systemic racism to build toward an anti-racist culture and create anti-racist policies and practices.

Thank you for the opportunity to share and for your consideration.”

Commissioner Updates were as follows:


